Since the new items have started I have been approached by two mums who were concerned about the amount of sugar, in particular the amount the new Belvita Breakfast Biscuits contained. My immediate reaction was to take the biscuits away to which I had many responses saying that they should stay included keeping hungry kids fed.

To this end I'm going to name the new and old items and the average of total sugars (natural and added) per 100g. This will also enable you to Google the items if you want information on other ingredients that make up the product.

This can be followed by a conversation with your child letting them know what you approve of them eating and a note with that same information sent to me so I can hand the note on to our Breaky Club Team and they can monitor who has what because they know all the kids.
