You can now officially express your interest in this program by following this link to the Northern Rivers Conservatorium website.

This won't be an actual enrolment, but rather a way for the Conservatorium to start planning for next vear.

Children wishing to learn stringed instruments will need to either have their own instrument or hire through the Conservatorium.

Group recorder lessons will be available at a lower cost. Recorders tend to have a bit of a bad reputation, but a quick Google search of "recorder ensemble" might change your mind. School recorder ensembles can be lots of fun! Recorder is also an excellent option for Stage 1 children wishing to play brass or woodwind instruments. As they grow they can move on to their preferred instrument.

Don't forget, we will be seeking funding to subsidise this program.

A limited amount of financial assistance is available from the Conservatorium in the form of bursaries. You can request a Bursary Application Form from the Conservatorium.

Please use the "Additional Notes" field if you are interested in more than one instrument.
