Principal's Message

We are heading rapidly towards the end of Semester 1. A part of this process is parent/carer interviews with Semester 1 reports a catalyst for conversation. These will be scheduled in Weeks 9 and 10. Even though we have had a state wide mandated assessment scale put up alongside our students for some time it continues to cause confusion. The assessment of achievements are listed below and will be on the front of every report, except Kindergarten, for reference.

Assessment of Achievement

Outstanding: The student has an extensive knowledge and understanding of the content and can readily apply this knowledge. In addition, the student has achieved a very high level of competence in the processes and skills and can apply these to new situations.

High: The student has a thorough knowledge and understanding of the content and a high level of competence in the processes and skills. In addition, the student is able to apply this knowledge and these skills to most situations.

Achieved: The student has a sound knowledge and understanding of the main areas of content and has achieved an adequate level of competence in the processes and skills.

Developing: The student has a basic knowledge and understanding of the content and has achieved a basic level of competence in the processes and skills.

Limited: The student has an elementary knowledge and understanding in few areas of the content and has achieved very limited competence in some of the processes and skills.

Assessment of Effort

Effort is shown using the scale 5 4 3 2 1 from most effort to least effort.

Therefore if your child receives an Achieved they're right on the money as to where they need to be. For those of us that are visual beings the insert to the right;

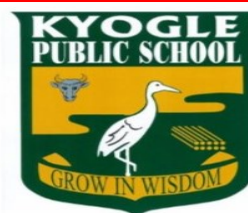

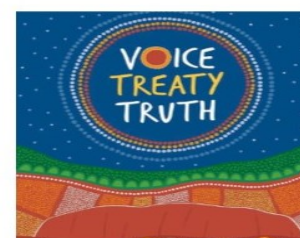
